

## Newsletter | October 2012

After a busy summer with UEFA EURO 2012 in Poland and Ukraine, EuroGames in Budapest and Mondiali Antirazzisti in Italy the autumn continues to be full of activities within the Football for Equality project. Next Tuesday (16. October) the 13th edition of the European wide FARE-Action Weeks against racism and discrimination in Football will start. They last until end of October – so this Football for Equality Newsletter is dedicated to Activities in the framework of Action Weeks 2012.

#### **Grass Roots activities during FARE-Action Weeks 2012**

As in the last 2 years, the Football for Equality project offers support for small activities against racism, discrimination and homophobia in football.

FairPlay-VIDC for example supports anti-sexist activities of the Fanclub of Wiener Sportklub (Freund innen der Friedhofstribüne) who have been active in the fight against racism and homophobia in the last years and now want to add the topic of gender equality to their agenda. Stickers and banners are produced.

Another grass roots project from Czech rebublic gains support: the group Barflies United (Barflies United), fans of Bohemians Praha 1905, organizes an anti-racism tournament in the Center of Praha. Two Polish initiatives will be supported as well: the factory for equality (fabrykarownosci) is going to organize an evening with Suzie Andreis, former football player, abut Tolerance in Football and the interconnection of homosexuality and women's football. The Campaign Against Homophobia (Kampania przeciw Homofobii) initiated the project "Fighting Homophobia in Sports" that tend to bring together LGBT activists and organizations with journalists. Within the FfE-projekt local trainings will be supported.

### **Campaign Material for Action Week Activities**

FairPlay produced stickers, posters, flags, banners, T-shirts,... targeting discrimination in football.

These Football for Equality-materials were sent to all project partners and will be distributed during the diverse Action Week-Activities in the 5 countries.

In Austria again the National FA takes part in the Action Weeks and at least two matches will be dedicated to the fight against discrimination. Also the Österreichische Bundesliga

(Austrian Club League) will participate: on the weekend 26-28 October all the matches will be played under to Slogan "Burst prejudices! / Vorurteile platzen lassen!". These activities are also part of the Football for Equality project.
